A National Honor for Bags of Love

Bags of Love Executive Director Becky Stenzel accepted the FBI's **2018 Director's Community Leadership Award** (DCLA) on behalf of BOL last week in what she described as "a very moving experience." Bags of Love was among the 57 individuals and organizations recognized this year at the FBI Headquarters in Washington, D.C., for "meeting a need, answering a call to serve, and working to make communities safer and stronger." The DCLA is **the highest civilian award given by the agency**, and every year, each of the FBI's 56 region field offices and the the Bureau's Criminal Justice Information Services Division selects a recipient. We were honored to be chosen this year by the Portland office.

FBI Director Christopher Wray presented the awards, noting that "You've identified some of the toughest problems that are out there. And you haven't waited for someone else to fix them." His comment that **"You're showing people kindness when they need it most"** especially resonated with the spirit of Bags of Love. You can read more about the awards and the other recipients on the FBI website <u>here</u>, and view a short video about the DCLA <u>here</u>.

Special Agent in Charge Renn Cannon, whose division nominated Bags of Love, observed that the award was given "in recognition of the many years of service the non-profit has given to thousands of Oregon's most vulnerable children" and that it has been "an honor for the FBI to partner with Bags of Love over the course of many years." Cannon appreciated the attention to detail our volunteers put into crafting bags filled with comfort items and necessities for children in crisis. **"These bags allow the donors and volunteers to give a child dignity while giving law enforcement officers a chance to building trust with those most impacted by trauma."** Cannon and Community Outreach Specialist Antonia Fabian Kreamier, both from the Portland FBI office and pictured below in the top center photo, both flew to D.C. for the presentation.

"This award belongs to ALL the people with huge hearts behind the scenes at Bags of Love," says Becky Stenzel. "We have such an amazing team of dedicated, kind, and talented volunteers and staff, and a generous community that supports our work.
