Now our 2024 - 2025 journey begins. Let us board our ship, raise our anchor, and set sail to our first port of call.

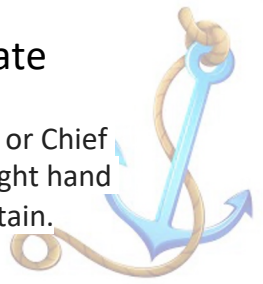
To my ship's crew, the board and committee chairman I appreciate that you have chosen to come aboard and serve with me. Helping to make this another successful year.

First a big thank you to Central District Eagle Crest for a fun filled weekend of Convention. Was so good to see and spend time with old friends.

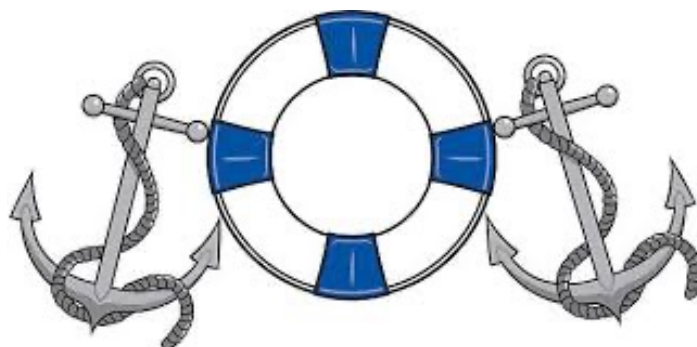

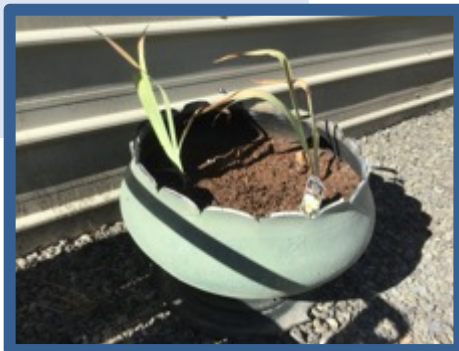

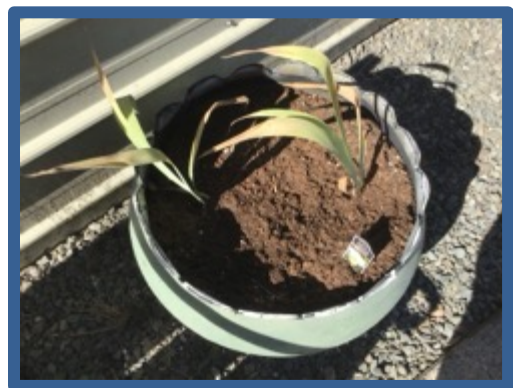
The convention minutes have been approved and sent to Chris for the web site.

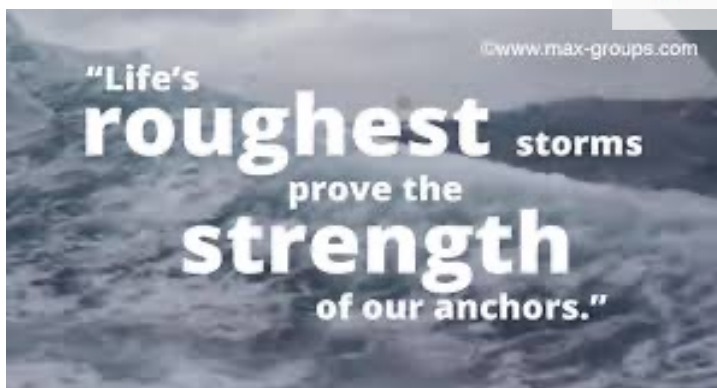
## Corresponding Secretary

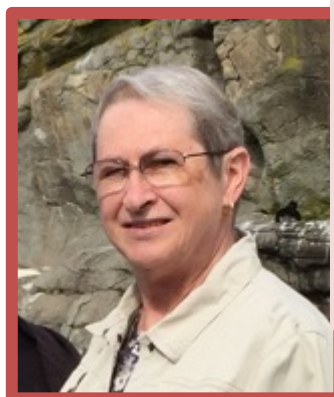

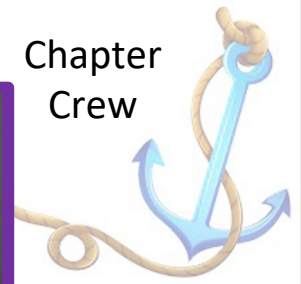

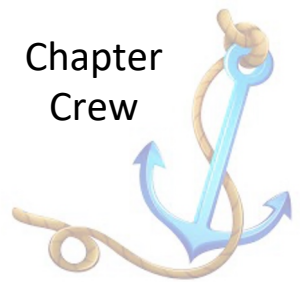




## Beta Eta, Sutherlin

## Delta Xi, Portland

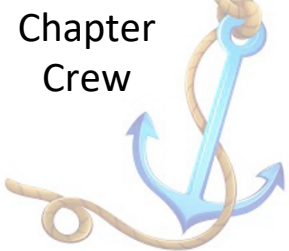

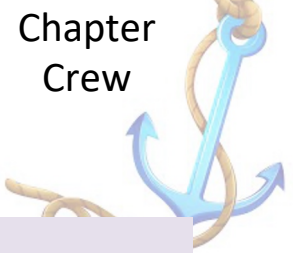

**Vice President – Della Schwab**, "Loggie"

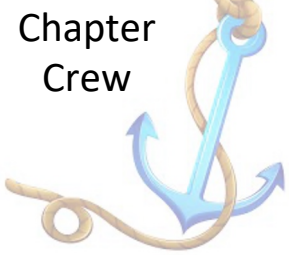
**Treasurer – Linda Gratteri**, "Olive Ridley"!

**NEW IRS REQUIRED ADDENDUM:** If you donated \$5,000 or more to any ONE charity this year you are required to submit this addendum with your tax facts form.

This form is vitally important to ESA chapters and councils because completion of the form by the annual September 15th deadline along with on-time payment of the chapter/council's International Council dues allows ESA's International Council to report financial information for the chapter/council and eliminates for the chapter (council) the step of filing a chapter (council) IRS return. **BOTH of these 2 steps, [paying IC Chapter](#) (or Council) dues by selecting Treasurer Dues Form,** AND completion of the tax form are required to eliminate the need for filing a tax return. Completed tax facts forms must be SUBMITTED by September 15 to ESA Headquarters. Late tax facts cannot be included on the IC Council blanket tax return. For more information, see page 2, "General Information" of the ESA Tax Facts form.
