But I find a continuing theme in these books, as well as those of other older chapters Alpha Iota, Alpha Zeta, Alpha Lambda, Jennie’s of Albany... mind you most of these hung around for fifty years or so...

We used to have “fun”... silly parties of “dress up” and costumes, Hobo parties, Gay nineties, 50’s parties, “alien parties”... we didn’t mind riding to a Sorority party in an alien outfit, all silver faced with tentacles protruding through our head, even making a couple of trips around the block to see who we could amuse. Perhaps this is why the Red Hat Society is so popular now! We weren’t afraid of having fun and making “fools” of ourselves...

Our ceremonies were special, pledge and jewel pin ... formal welcomings and celebrations with banners, corsages and “dress up”... Installations were also special, no jeans and dungarees, but party dresses (I know we don’t even own a party dress anymore), Formal Outstanding Member Balls and dances.

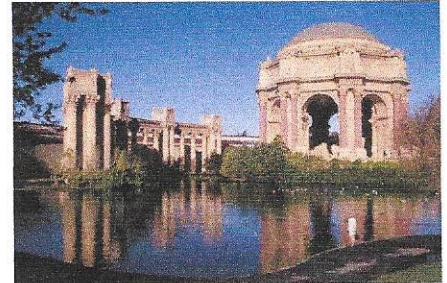

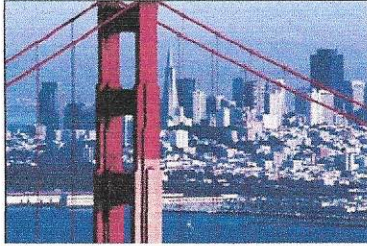
