
Recording Secretary


I'm not going to let the cat out of the bag just yet, but be sure to plan on joining in.

Congratulations to all our ESA Oregon members. During the 2014 - 2015 year we raised \$126,831 for St. Jude Children's Research
Hospital!

The goal this year for ESA was to surpass the cumulative totals of \$200 million for St. Jude. This year ESA members raised \$16,727.662 which put us over our goal. We have now raised \$208,481.968 during the past 42 years. We will now work towards \$300 million. It has been decided that Oregon ESA will have a St. Jude Virtual Run/Walk before and during Leadership on September 26, 2015. Our name is, "Team ESA Oregon Virtual". We will have a slight twist as we will also have a SHORT walk at Leadership, September 26, 2015, for those attending. It will be held before our 1st meeting on Saturday morning.
