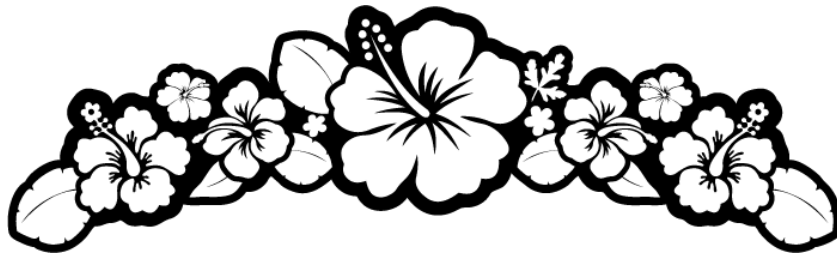




From your Treasurer

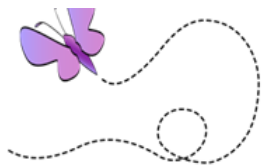

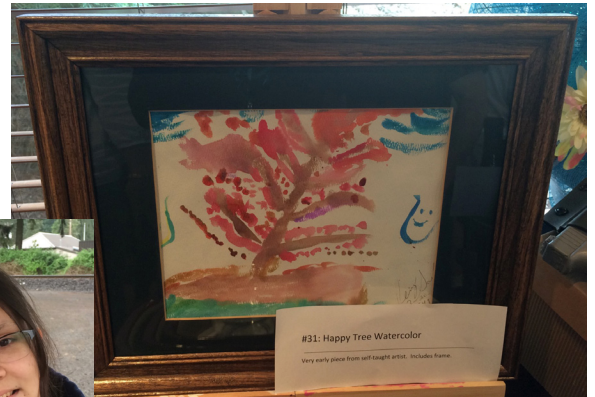

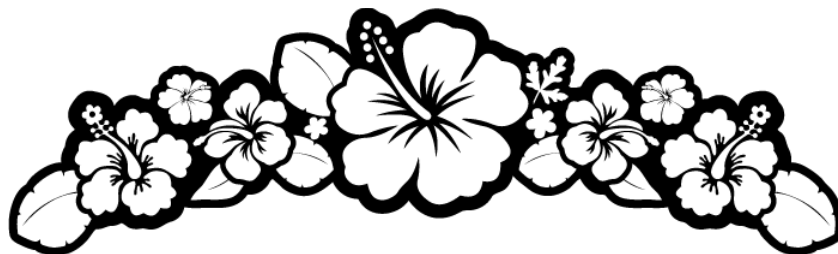
SOUTHERN DISTRICT COUNCIL
