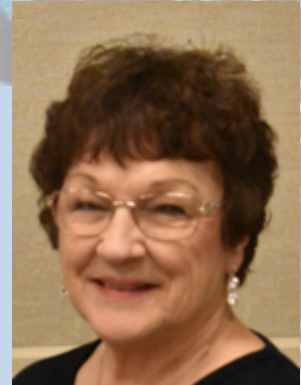

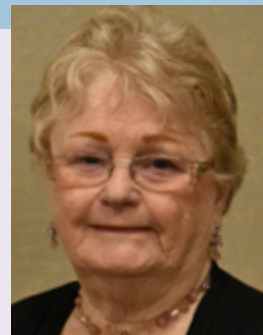
Hello Sisters:

Oregon State Credentials Report

Just thought I should remind everyone that the Credentials Proxy form is in the President's Booklet and on the website. Since we will be voting at convention for next year's officers, and there are contested offices, you will want to fill out a Proxy form if you are not going to be able to attend State Convention in Hood River.

Credential cards are issued to eligible voting members during registration at each state meeting. To be eligible, voting members must be members in good standing, requiring that all individual ESA dues, Chapter IC dues and Chapter Oregon State dues have been paid.

According to the Oregon State By-Laws annual dues of \$15 per chapter member shall be paid to the State Treasury by May 1 and shall be delinquent by June 15. Since State Convention is the end of June I remind all chapters that these dues will need to be paid for all members to vote. Please send them to our Treasurer Connie Russell with a roster of who is paying so that she will be able to get me a report of active members.

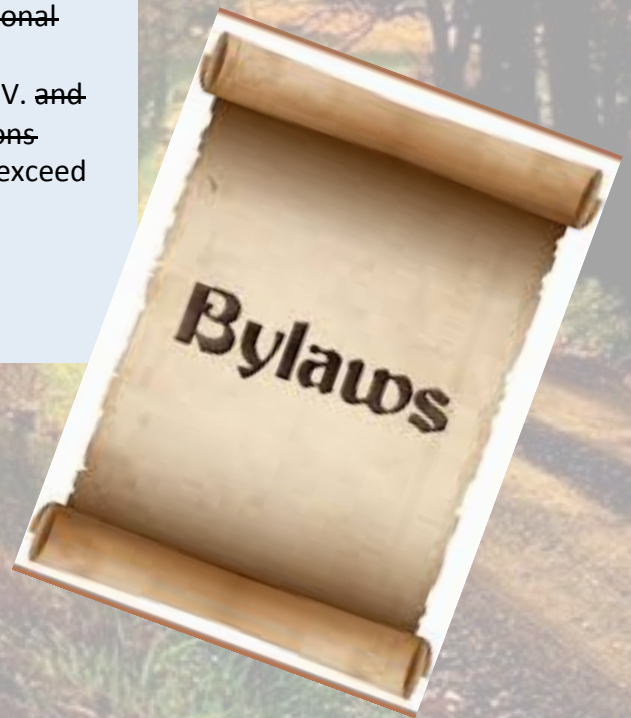


INTERNATIONAL COUNCIL BYLAW CHANGE

Received from IC Corresponding Secretary Linda Schmidt for Celeste Webb, IC Parliamentarian, and was asked to share it with state members.

Section 2. ~~Ballot Vote and Nominations from the Floor Voting~~

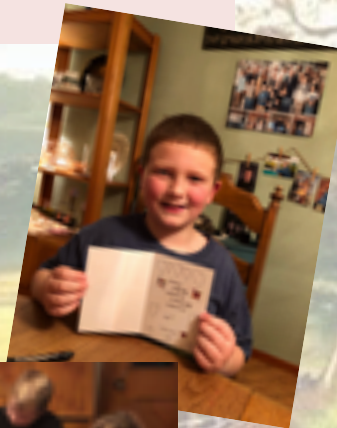
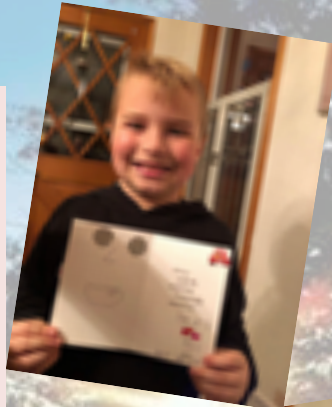
~~Officers~~ Candidates shall be elected according to a preferential electronic voting system approved by the Executive Board by ~~ballot~~ vote at the annual meeting. A ballot containing the names of the nominees shall be distributed via email before the date of the annual election. Nominations may be made from the floor for all offices with the exception of President. "Notice of Intent to Nominate" for all offices with the exception of President from the floor shall be submitted in writing to the First Vice President, 60 days prior to ~~International Convention~~ the annual election. Candidates so nominated must conform to provisions of Article V. ~~and shall have three minutes to have their qualifications presented.~~ Nominations for each office shall not exceed five. Voting shall begin after the close of the First General Assembly.

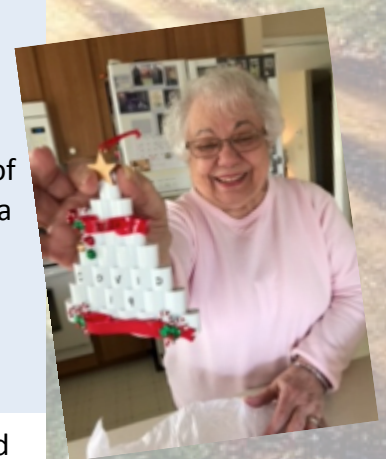
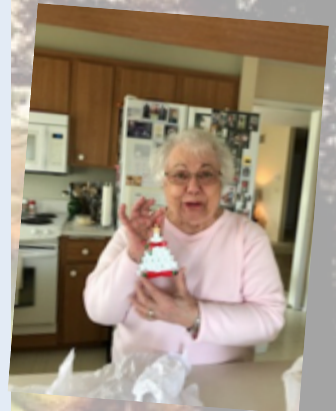

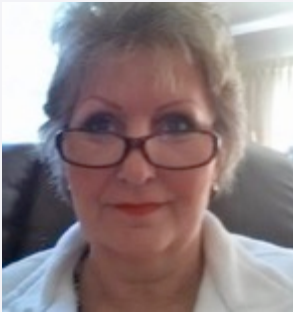
