
Outgoing Treasurers Report

As I was thinking about some educational ideas you might use for this coming year, I realized that there are at least two ways to look at President Debbie's Theme: ESA – Recipe for Success so I am hoping to help you Spice up your Year with Some Tasty Educationals!

This focus on Recipes can be taken literally on recipes for cooking and food. It can also be taken figuratively; the Recipes for Success in both ESA and in life. Or you can choose to include a mix of both.

Here are some ideas for your Chapter educationals this year based on a traditional recipe theme:

Have a recipe exchange

Talk about The Best Thing I Ever Ate!

Have a Chapter potluck using recipes from a specific country or ethnicity

Talk about your family favorite recipes and share them

Visit restaurants that are new to some members or go to each member's favorite place to eat

Visit a winery or brew pub in your area

Learn about foods that are new to the US. For instance Quinoa; how to pronounce it (KEEN-

Wawe—rhymes with awe), their history, where they are from, and recipes for them!

Give tips on the best, must have kitchen gadgets and how to use them

Explore how recipes and the way that people cook has changed over the years

"Visit" places around the worlds that are known for their cuisines via the internet

Give guidance on food safety

Learn about what foods are served for special occasions and holidays in other cultures

If you choose to learn about how to find some Recipes for Success in your ESA experience and in your life:

Learn about motivational speakers who help people achieve success

Spend the year going through a self-improvement book with the group

Give tips that help people work in groups more successfully

Find ways to increase self-esteem and teach them to your Chapter

Explore ways to mitigate stress and improve communication

Learn that success is often preceded by failures, the key is to keep working toward your goals

Work to get past fear of failure, the main thing holding many of us back from true success

Here are some quotes to help you begin thinking about what you might want to include in your educationals:


